

## DEFINITION OF SERVICES

*The following definitions provide a general overview of services which may be included on a Request for Proposal (RFP). Specific requirements and standards for each service will be included in the RFP. Only vendors who respond to the RFP, demonstrate they meet the requirement and standards, and are lowest price, will be awarded Blanket Purchase Agreements (BPAs).*

SERVICE	DESCRIPTION
Outpatient Substance Abuse Treatment/Testing	Treatment typically consists of weekly cognitive behavioral group. May include individual counseling. Testing includes urinalysis and Breathalyzer provided randomly, including weekends and holidays.
Outpatient Mental Health/Co-Occurring Treatment	Typically weekly individual or group therapy provided by licensed clinicians, psychiatric services, medication services, lab, and physical exam.
Intensive Outpatient Substance Abuse Treatment	A minimum of three hours per day of counseling (individual and group) typically provided three days per week.
Intensive Outpatient Mental Health/Co-Occurring Treatment	A minimum of three hours per day in counseling (individual and group) provided by licensed clinicians, typically provided three days per week. Includes psychiatric and medication services.
Inpatient Medical Detox	In a 24 hour medically supervised setting.
Residential Substance Abuse Treatment	Therapeutic community for a minimum of 90 days within a highly structured environment that incorporates counseling and drug testing.
Residential Substance Abuse Treatment for Parents and Children	Same as above, but for women or men with children.
Residential Co-Occurring Treatment	Intensive residential treatment program for individuals who are suffering from both chemical abuse/dependence and severe mental health disorder. Program provides a highly structured environment that incorporates counseling, psychiatric services and drug testing.
Case Management	The securing of financial benefits (such as: ACA, SSI, SSDI, Medi-Cal and Medi-Care) and non-contract mental health services (County, MHSA, health care reform, etc.) for offenders and defendants by experienced benefits counselors. Services will likely be field based.
